The European Theatre Architecture (EUTA) database is a long-term project initiated by the Arts and Theatre Institute, Prague. The database is being realized in collaboration with institutions from several European countries and with the support of the European Union, the Czech Ministry of Culture, and other organizations. The database is one of the main outputs of the project Theatre Architecture in Central Europe (TACE) which was realized in 2008-2011 with a grant from the Culture Programme of the European Union. This project included support for a technical solution, and the database was filled with information on more than 200 theatre buildings. The comprehensive encyclopaedic entries were written by experts in the field of architectural history based on detailed archival research. The database includes information on theatres in the Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary, Slovakia and Slovenia. The database can display the theatres on a map with a chronological filter and on a timeline.


Pilsen Architecture Manual (PAM) is an expert/popularisation project that maps the architecture of the period of 1914–1950 in Pilsen. It aims to present individual buildings, architects, builders, selected public spaces and city districts to both the public and experts. It contains an on-line database and map brochures, and audio recordings and signs placed in public places – all of this in both Czech and English versions. The main goal of the project is to mediate experience with architecture that is exhibited in situ. The database has been freely available on the PAM website since April 2015 and now contains about 400 sites and building complexes documented with 230 texts, more than 1,200 contemporary photographs, approximately 2,700 reproductions of original plans and hundreds of other archival documents. The database also includes a survey of more than 100 architects and builders and 35 public spaces.






